Provision Map



Did you know that at Cedars Park, we adapt our teaching to suit the needs of all pupils, regardless of whether they have a special educational need.

However, when children require support that is 'additional to and different from' (SEN Code of Practice, p97) our universal offer in order to access the school curriculum, they are placed on the SEN register. As part of being on the SEN Register, pupils may receive external agency support and will have clear targets and provision in place to help them make progress from their starting points. You can stay up to date with their provision maps and learning plans on 'Provision Map', which allows parents to be an integral in the target setting process.

Ofsted

We are all very proud of our latest Ofsted judgement, where we were awarded 'good'. It is lovely that the hard work and dedication of all staff in our school has been recognised. I would like to take the opportunity to draw your attention to what the inspectors thought about the SEN provision at Cedars. During the two day inspection, they spoke to children, staff and parents of SEN learners. They also observed lessons, interventions and looked through children's SEN paperwork.

"Pupils with special educational needs and/
or disabilities (SEND), leaders work supportively with teachers to identify emerging
needs and put adaptations in place. These
changes help pupils with SEND to access
learning in class, making progress from their
starting points. As needed, leaders work
closely with other agencies to secure support
for their pupils."
