Some highlights have included visitors to the school: in Year 5, the children became honorary level 10 chocolatiers for the day. The children looked great dressed up as characters from their favourite books. They loved sharing their chosen texts with their peers, as well as enjoying a story with their chosen teacher too.

Another highlight of the day for KS2 pupils was spending time in a special assembly with award-winning children's author, Nizrana Farook. Nizrana, who is the Year 4 author and has written a number of well-known books such as 'The Girl Who Stole an Elephant,' spoke to the children about the craft of a writer and her writing process. Most excitingly, she revealed that a character in her next book shares the same name as one of our pupils in Year 3!
